FEEDBACK REPORT

Department of Bengali has collected the feedback forms from the students of 2nd year Honours of 2017-18 session. Following observations are—

- 1. Library books are not sufficient for the total number of students.
- 2. 60% of the students have informed that 80% of the syllabus was covered by the teachers in this academic session. The rest amount remained incomplete.
- 3. The students demanded a changed format of questions, like MCQ.
- 4. The unhygienic condition of college canteen and the slippery entrance of the college (caused by the mishandling of the water purifier) are two major problematic issues drawn by the students.
- 5. Some of the students have praised about the comparatively low fees structure on behalf of their parents.

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

Feedback Report Analysis of B.A. History (Hons.) First Year Students 2017-18 All the respondents agree that classes are held regularly. However, while 42% of the respondents say that the entire syllabus have been covered in the class, 29% think that about 90% of the syllabus had been covered, and 29% say that the figure is about 80%. All the students say that class tests were regularly held. 83% of the students are happy with the quality of teaching, while 17% think that teaching is adequate, but needs some improvement. 68% of the students say that teachers are ready to help at all the time, while 32% think that teachers are helpful occasionally. 83% of the respondents think that all the necessary books are available in the library, but 17% think that the library does not contain enough books. Everybody seems happy with the present course and syllabus except one student who thinks it is impossible to score good marks even if one studies hard, in the present system. All the respondents have a positive opinion about the different departments of the college. Most of the students and their guardians are happy with the overall condition of the college, though some students complain about the lack of a playground and of a cycle stand. Some students recommended the use of ICT in the classes of all other departments as well. Kanad Sinha

Summary of the Student Feedbacks: Third Year History (Hons.) 2017-18

Among the History (Hons.) Third Year students who submitted the feedback form, 84% said that all classes were regularly held, while the other 16% also think that most of the classes were held regularly. There is a discrepancy among the respondents about how much of the syllabus had been covered in the class. 19% opined that the entire syllabus was taken care of, while 43% of the respondents answered that about 90% was covered, 23% stated that about 80% of the syllabus was covered, and 15% think that it was only about 70% of the syllabus. All the respondents replied that class tests were held regularly, though 14% would have liked more class tests. 82% of the students are happy with the standard of teaching, while 18% think that there is room for improvement. 84% of the respondents had found the teachers always ready to help, even outside the classroom, 13% found the teachers occasionally helpful, and one respondent found them totally indifferent. 52% of the students are happy with the amount of books in the library, but 48% are not. Lack of books in the library is among the major concerns expressed by the students, the others being the shortage of drinking water in the college and the poor quality and high price of the food in the canteen. Students more or less found the syllabus relevant and helpful, but complained about shortage of time. They also complained about the high rate of fines in the college and the insufficient use of the technological facilities, such as the digital classroom, in teaching. Many students have recommended more careful measures to improve the College's natural environment, including planting more trees and protecting the pond. Some students have also suggested to ban the use of mobile phones in the library and to organise more sports events. Kanad Sinha
